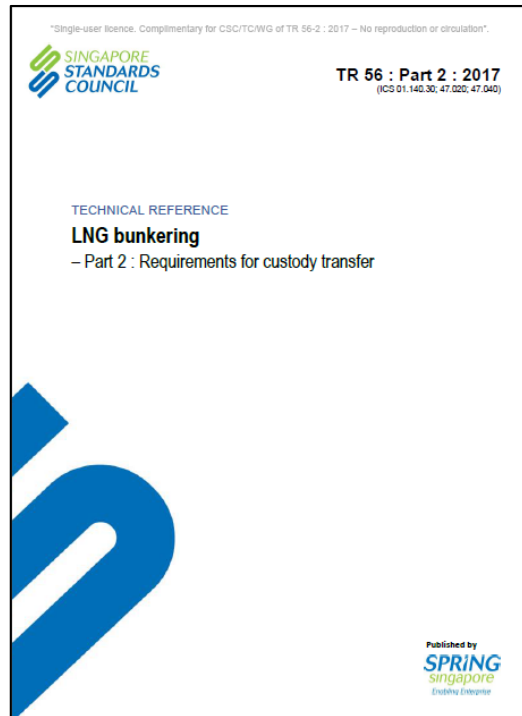
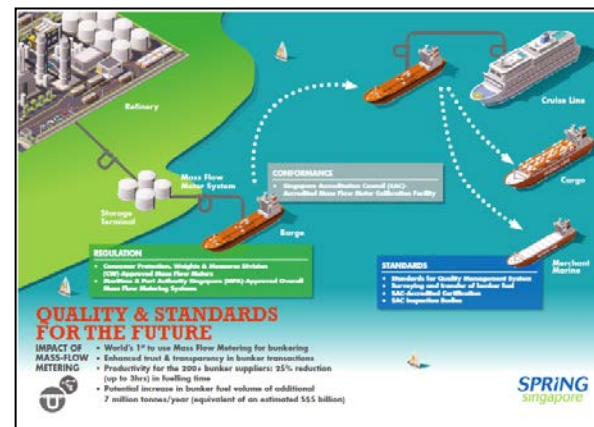

 An Act relating to the use of uniform weights and measures throughout Singapore.  
 [1st January 1976]  
 PART I  
 PRELIMINARY  
**Short title**  
 1. This Act may be cited as the Weights and Measures Act.  
**Interpretation**  
 2.—(1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires —  
 “Accuracy Label” means a mark referred to in section 7(2)(ii) (B) for use as evidence of the passing of any weighing or measuring instrument as fit for use for trade;

**WEIGHTS AND MEASURES ACT (CHAPTER 349)**  
**WEIGHTS AND MEASURES REGULATIONS 2005**  
 In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 7, 9, 10 and 37 of the Weights and Measures Act, the Minister for Trade and Industry hereby makes the following Regulations:  
 PART I  
 PRELIMINARY  
**Citation and commencement**  
 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Weights and Measures Regulations 2005 and shall come into operation on 1st January 2006.  
**Definitions**  
 2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires —  
 “International Recommendation” means an international recommendation published by OIML as a model regulation generally establishing the metrological characteristics required for the weighing and measuring instruments;  
 “liteng” means an unequal armed balance of a capacity not exceeding 16 tahlil for traditional weighing of Chinese herbs;  
 “OIML” means the International Organisation of Legal Metrology.
